BUSCOT & COLESHILL HERITAGE & RURAL SKILLS CENTRE - HELP AND SUPPORTED NEEDED

During the summer we will relocate to a new dedicated Grade II listed Yard at Buscot, which is part of a National Trust estate. The new site will provide much enhanced facilities for the emerging makers participating in the Bishopsland programme, as well as incubation workshops (from 2025) and a home for the Tools Library. We will have two large workshops, a spacious kitchen, modern WCs, indoor and outside relaxation and creative spaces. Residential accommodation will be in National Trust cottages which are modern, clean & warm. (see plans on page 5)

This is a significant financial resource undertaking by Bishopsland and we REALLY need your help. Financially we are drawing on every source of funding but there is a significant shortfall.

The very sad winding up of Scottish Goldsmiths Trust last month just underlines how precarious funding is for charitable Arts organisations.
